

54 pairs plus 14 pairs gimps

Any thread with a wpc count of between 28 and 34 threads can be used with this pattern.

Flinders St Station

On 21 December 2017 there was a serious incident at the entrance to the Flinders Street Train Station where a 4 wheel drive was deliberately driven into innocent pedestrians.

Stitches recommended

3 pin whole stitch (CTCT) fans
1.5 pin torchon footside with 3 pairs of passives
Torchon ground (CTpCT)
CTCTTpCTCTT ground
Gimp
Single Roseground
Cloth Stitch buds with gimp
Cloth stitch narrow trail
Cloth stitch bud
Honeycomb

Materials

54 pairs 14 pairs gimp

Open start




Fig 1: open paired start

In this start we hang 2 pairs open (rainbow) over the 5 top hanging pins. The pairs are now seperated . add 2 twists to the left hand bobbins (see Fig. 1)

Secure the left pairs to the pillow while working the first fan on the right.

The left pairs will become the worker pair for the fans on the left.

Hanging in central pairs

These pairs are hung in at the red dots, linking the fans to the body of the work.

Gimp

Choose a gimp thread that is 8+ times thicker than the main thread.

Make sure that the main thread pair you are goiing to surround the gimp with has 2 twists to start with as you loose a twist in the gimp process.

Lift the left main thread bobbin, lay in the gimp, lay the left bobbin back and twist the main thread pair. Thus sandwiching the gimp :-)



Ending the gimp

The gimp in this pattern ends inside the pattern rather than running out at an edge.


To get a nice neat finish work the left gimp across the bottom but do not close the main threads yet.

Work the right thread across the bottom and then close the main threads with the twists. Leave a long tail at the moment.

Cut the gimp close to the work after the work has been blocked and the pins removed.




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Honeycomb Stitch


Worked on the diagonal this lovely stitch uses a 3x3 pin area comprised of Cross, Twist, Twist, pin, Cross, Twist, Twist (CTTpCTT) in the following sequence.




Narrow Cloth Stitch Trail


Defined as a trail over a 2-3 pin width

I have chosen to use cloth stitch (CTC) trail over 2 pin width.





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
